



*Tools:*

- White Vinegar- at least 1.5 cups of (you may need more if you have a really big shower head)
- Freezer bag- (you know the ones that are nice and thick)
- 2 or 3 thick rubber bands

*Directions:*

First pour water into the bag and check for any leaks. If there aren't any, then use the water to water your plants and pour the white vinegar into the bag. Then carefully lift the bag by the edges

up around the shower head until it's submerged fully in the vinegar, and then use the rubber bands to secure it so it won't fall. Leave the bag on overnight (at least 8 hours) and in the morning,

use a toothbrush or a toothpick to loosen mineral deposits left and voila! A drastically clearer shower head, with water that flows freely. The great thing about this method is that you don't have to dismantle the whole shower head to fix it.



*Note: For heavier clogs, use a wrench to remove the shower head and then submerge the whole shower head in a bucket of about a half-gallon of vinegar overnight.*
